Dr. Adam J. Locketz earned a Bachelor of Science from the University of Wisconsin (1995). He was both a music major and achieved the pre-requisites needed to apply for medical school. He finished those prerequisites for a baccalaureate at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities where his GPA was a 4.0.

While at Madison he mentored with many like-minded individuals who helped shape his early interests in music, healing, nutrition, and overall wellness.
